<u>Rationale</u>: The weather is warming up and the official start of Spring is Monday 20th March 2023! We are excited to see all things that grow and have a go at planting and tending to some flowers and plants in our learning garden! We are kicking this topic off with a fun-filled Shrove Tuesday making pancakes. This topic the children will be putting their scientific knowledge and skills to the test, learning about things that grow including plants and animals, making observations of these, and creating their own telephones during British Science Week whilst finding out who Alexander Graham Bell is. We will be learning about the Spring season and recapping our learning on Autumn and Winter as well, comparing and finding the differences between all these seasons. The children will get to experience caterpillars growing and metamorphosising into butterflies and learning about the lifecycle of a caterpillar. We will also learn about recycling and reusing and how to create something new out of old materials.

Choose one and create a poster with your grown up which explains the animal's habitat, diet, and behaviour. Due Friday 24th March

- Exploring or watching videos on how animals and plants live, and grow will link into our learning in the classroom as well as any learning on the four seasons.
- Weekend challenges will be posted to Class Dojo every Friday and our 'Homework Heroes' award will be handed out to two pupils each Friday celebration time!
- Staying fit and healthy with plenty of outdoor or indoor physical activity promotes well-being and good motor and muscular development in children which will help them in writing, focussing attention, and other curriculum areas.
