<u>Animals</u>


- <u>Amphibians</u>: amphibians live in the water as babies and on land as they grow older. They have smooth, slimy skin.
- <u>Birds:</u> all birds have a beak, two legs, feathers and wings
- <u>Fish:</u> fish live and breathe under water. They have scaly skin, fins to help them swim and they breath through gills.
- <u>Mammals</u>: mammals are animals that breathe air, grown hair or fur and feed on their mother's milk as a baby.
- <u>Reptiles:</u> all reptiles breathe air. They have scales on their skin.
- <u>Carnivore</u>: animals that eat other animals (meat) are carnivores.
- <u>Herbivore:</u> animals that only eat plants are her<mark>bi</mark>vores.
- <u>Omnivores:</u> animals that eat both plants and other animals are omnivores.

<u>Humans</u>

- <u>Sight: your eyes let you see all the things</u> around you.
- <u>Hearing</u>: your ears let you listen to all the things around you. Your brain is able to tell what different sounds are.
- <u>Touch:</u> Your skin gives you the sense of touch. You can tell if something is warm, cold, smooth or rough without even looking at it!
- <u>Taste: your sense of taste comes from your tongue. You can tell if somethings tastes bitter or sweet.</u> You might have some tastes you like and some you don't.
- <u>Smell: you smell using your nose</u>. Your nose can tell if things smell nice or not nice.

<u>Plants and trees</u>


- People may grow plants in their gardens with a seed or bulb. For example, this could be sunflowers, roses, lavender, tulips or even a vegetable patch.
- A wild plant will grow by itself. For example, a daisy, a dandelion, a buttercup or nettles.
- Decidious trees lose their leaves in the Autumn every year. Their leaves are generally broad, flat and have veins running through them.
- Evergreen trees have green leaves all year round. Their leaves are generally thick, waxy and narrow like needles.



<u>Seasonal Changes</u>

- There are 4 seasons.
- Autumn temperatures drop after summer. Leaves change colour and fall from decidious trees.
- Winter the coldest time of the year. We sometimes see snow and frost in the morning.
- Spring temperature rises after summer and flowers begin to grow.
- Summer the hottest time of the year, usually sunshine and dry weather.
 Flowers and trees are in bloom.
- In winter the sun rises later and sets earlier
- In the summer the sun rises earlier and sets later.
